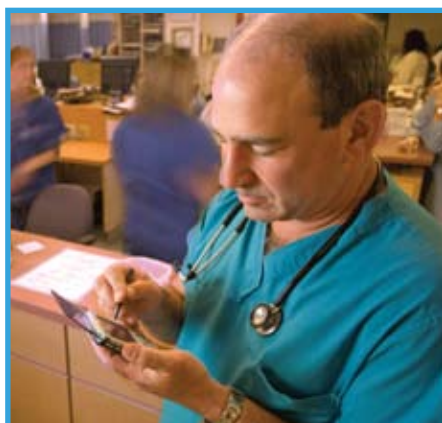

We are committed to performing our activities with respect and transparency. All board members, management, staff and volunteers meet the highest standards of personal and professional integrity.

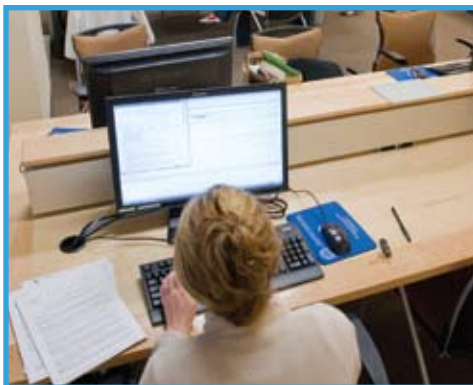


Openness

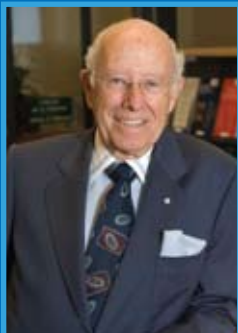

Endowments

Dr. Henry Kravitz Psychoanalytic Psychotherapy Service

Through the philanthropy of JGH donors **Claire and Philip Borrow**, this service is now in operation at the Institute of Community and Family Psychiatry. Patients who need longer and more intense therapy sessions can have them for a nominal fee. Thanks to this much-needed initiative, patients do not face the difficult task of having to find affordable mental health services. ■

Department of Medicine

This department, which is the largest at the JGH and consists of 14 divisions, has received additional financial support through the generosity of **Dianne and Aldo Bensadoun**. Their donation will benefit specific hospital initiatives, as well as the department's top priorities. Part of their donation will also support the laboratory and the work of the department's Physician-in-Chief, Dr. Ernesto Schiffrin, and his colleague, Dr. Stéphanie Lehoux, in the field of hypertension disease. ■

Cardiology and Oncology

The kindness and visionary thinking of donor **Vanda Treiser** have enabled the Division of Cardiology and the Department of Oncology to acquire new equipment and to conduct medical research. The JGH and the Foundation are grateful to Mrs. Treiser for recognizing the importance of creating an endowment, which will forever carry the name of her beloved late husband, Benjamin (Bela) Treiser. ■

Renovations

The Beryl and Ralph Goldman Herzl Family Practice Centre

Originally opened in 1912 as the Herzl Dispensary, this longstanding Montreal health service has found its newest home in the JGH's Pavilion H. What began as a small treatment centre for newly arrived Jewish immigrants from Eastern Europe now serves people with roots in 150 nations. Many of these individuals live in an 80-block sector of the Côte-des-Neiges neighbourhood. In total, the Beryl and Ralph Goldman Herzl Family Practice Centre cares for 20,000 patients who can take advantage of an outpatient clinic, a walk-in clinic, an after-hours clinic with triage, and a family medicine ward. The kindness and financial support of **Beryl Goldman** and her late husband, **Ralph Goldman**, have made the Centre a bright and spacious place that can handle many patients with efficiency and ease. ■

6 North

This unit, formerly used for geriatric patients requiring long-term care, is now home to Family Medicine patients. Through the patronage of the Foundation, this 22-bed unit was completely renovated to include a new nursing station, medication centre, shower stalls and furniture. Staff have described the transformation as "a contrast between night and day", since the area is now bright and spacious, which boosts patients' emotional well-being. ■



Equipment

Da Vinci Surgical System

This ground-breaking tool, which uses robotic technology to enhance surgeons' skills, was brought to the Jewish General Hospital through the generosity and initiative of **Sheryl and Ronald Black** and their friends, and **Dr. Sheila and Nahum Gelber, Q.C.** As the most advanced device of its kind in Quebec, this innovative system allows doctors to perform minimally invasive surgery that might otherwise be too delicate or difficult. As a result of this precision, patients generally experience quicker recovery times, less scarring and blood loss, and a lower risk of complications. The da Vinci Surgical System is currently used for patients in such areas as Urology, Cardiac Surgery, Gynecologic Oncology and General Surgery (e.g., intestinal and esophageal surgery). ■

Chartmaxx

Obtained through the patronage of **Nan and William Lassner**, Chartmaxx is the latest in digital archiving technology for medical records. Fast, easy and paperless, this system is used mainly by nursing units, clinics and the Emergency Department to gain electronic access to patients' files. The installation of Chartmaxx has helped to reduce waiting times, because staff can obtain information and see patients more quickly. As an added bonus, a single digital chart can be viewed simultaneously on multiple computers throughout the hospital. ■



Events

Every year, the JGH Foundation hosts a variety of fund-raising events that support many medical initiatives from cancer treatment and research to high-tech equipment and recruitment. Whether it is a Foundation initiative on the golf course or a third-party event from which the Foundation benefits, the hard work and dedication of the organizers and participants is a shining example of how people can make a difference. ■

Evening in Athens – May 12, 2007

An event of Grecian splendour awaited all those who attended the 4th Evening in Athens at Bonsecours Market, chaired by Mary Kounadis. This gala raised **\$240,000** for the purchase of a mobile x-ray machine for the Department of Orthopedics. ■

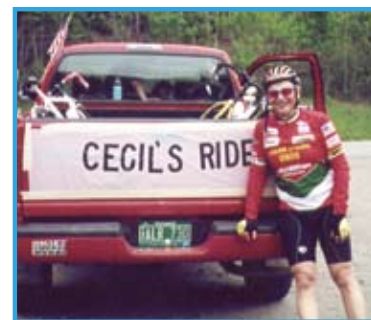


15th Annual JGH Silver Star Mercedes-Benz Golf Classic – June 4, 2007
