UNCOMMON DEDICATION FOR AN UNCOMMON TIME

A MESSAGE FROM THE JEWISH GENERAL HOSPITAL



Despite everyone's best efforts, the COVID-19 pandemic that began in early 2020 has lasted well into 2021. Nevertheless, the work of that first year created a firm foundation, enabling the Jewish General Hospital and CIUSSS West-Central Montreal to do their utmost on behalf of those who rely on them.

Especially noteworthy was the way our staff distinguished themselves so admirably and for so long, despite the stress, long hours and personal sacrifices. Their exemplary decisions and actions throughout this pandemic directly influenced the lives of tens of thousands of patients and clients—many of them frail, elderly or chronically ill—as well as their families.

Not only was care provided to those who had been hospitalized with the virus, our personnel moved with remarkable speed to implement telehealth practically from scratch. Visual platforms, such as Zoom and Teams, enabled them to stay in regular touch with healthcare users at home. As a result, numerous members of the public were able to obtain answers to their urgent questions, while many others received certain services remotely—for instance, mental health counselling, physiotherapy and pre-natal advice.

Furthermore, in the earliest months of 2021, our staff made great strides in beginning the major task of vaccinating themselves and the public—one of the first healthcare networks in Quebec to do so. For this and many other

achievements, we owe each and every member of staff a debt of gratitude for their dedication, diligence, perseverance and incredible stamina in making telehealth a day-to-day reality.

Throughout the year, our staff have been bolstered by the kind and committed donors of the JGH Foundation. Despite the pandemic, the exemplary generosity of donors has continued to spur world-class innovation and ground-breaking research. Notably in 2020-2021, this included the launch of the Carole and Andrew Harper Psychiatry Inpatient Unit and the development of the Centre of Excellence in Infectious Diseases.

Unfortunately, COVID-19 remained a malevolent presence throughout 2021. Even so, we have come away knowing that when a crisis strikes, we have the capability and the will to work together in support of those whose lives depend on us.

While the pandemic was not the catalyst that any of us wanted, it demonstrated the importance of digital connectedness in health systems, something in which the JGH was already leading the way. Given the current technologies and the new ones that seem to appear almost every day, we have begun a true transformation in the way we deliver health care and improve patient care. THE CENTRE OF EXCELLENCE IN INFECTIOUS DISEASES

In the spring of 2020, with the coronavirus impacting each and every one of us, “people began to recognize the importance of investing in research to fight infectious diseases,” recalls visionary leader, Pierre R. Brosseau, a long-time supporter of the JGH who spearheaded the \$7.5 million campaign for the newly formed Centre of Excellence in Infectious Diseases at the Hospital. Headed up by Chief of Infectious Diseases, Dr. Karl Weiss, “the Centre will be home to seven new microbiologists, who will devote themselves to the discovery of novel means to prevent antibiotic resistance, as well as research into other viral and infectious diseases.

“We must be ready for what comes next. We have seen first-hand the impact of COVID-19 on our society, our health, our way of life. It is only through cutting-edge research—the kind that happens at the JGH—that we will be able to meet the next microbial foe head-on.”

NEW TELEHEALTH INTERVENTION PROGRAM FOR ISOLATED OLDER ADULTS

Thanks to the generosity of donors, and over 120 volunteers recruited through the Foundation, the JGH launched the new Telehealth Intervention Program for Isolated Older Adults (TIP-OA) with the goal of aiding elderly individuals, who are more likely to experience anxiety and depression as a result of the pandemic.

“We know that older adults are disproportionately affected by this crisis because they are already prone to isolation,” says Dr. Blanca Vacaflor, a geriatric psychiatry resident at the JGH and Co-Director of the program with JGH Geriatric Psychiatrist Dr. Soham Rej. “Moreover, they are at the highest risk of mortality from COVID-19. With these factors in mind, we initiated a unique clinical trial to help alleviate the stress on this population.” This data-driven assessment of new methods for delivery of mental health services to the elderly is anticipated to result in expanded access beyond the demands of the current pandemic.



MORE EXAMPLES OF YOUR IMPACT DURING THE PANDEMIC

- As part of the Sharon Azrieli Creative Space, the acquisition of 3 state-of-the-art industrial 3D printers enabled the JGH to develop prototype ventilators to help fight COVID-19 and to create other critical equipment for the future.
- Successful pivot to telehealth: 80% of all visits at the Goldman Herzl Family Practice Centre at the JGH were done via telehealth; virtual oncology visits were optimized at the JGH’s Segal Cancer Centre; significant investment was made in telepsychiatry infrastructure to help people remotely through pandemic-related distress.
- Leveraging artificial intelligence to predict where the virus will hit and warn at-risk individuals.
- Collaborative clinical trials including to study whether the plasma of recovered patients could be used to treat COVID-19.

As the province's leading acute-care hospital, responding to the changing demographics and medical needs of our patients is of the utmost priority. For the Foundation, this means enabling an ever-increasing emphasis on collaborative and connected care, pioneering strategies in preventative healthcare, and modernizing facilities and services.



DA VINCI ROBOT CRITICAL TO SAVING LIVES

When Ian Henriques learned he would need cardiac surgery, he put his heart in the hands of his cardiac surgeon, Dr. Emmanuel Moss, and the rotating arms of the Da Vinci Robot—one of two at the Hospital, made possible thanks to the generosity of Foundation donors. "I was nervous but felt reassured by the professionals at the JGH, and three days post Robotic Coronary Artery Bypass Grafting (CABG), I was home and felt great." Robotically-assisted heart surgery, also called closed-chest heart surgery, involves a specially-designed computer console for the cardiac surgeon to control surgical instruments on thin robotic arms.

"In the robotic surgery that we do, recovery takes weeks instead of months," says **Dr. Moss**, one of the only surgeons in Canada routinely performing both robotic mitral valve and coronary bypass surgeries. "Patients spend less time in the ICU, less time on a breathing machine, less chance of needing blood transfusions and overall, the recovery is faster after the surgery."

NEW CAROLE AND ANDREW HARPER PSYCHIATRY INPATIENT UNIT OPENS

“Our patients deserve to be cared for in a setting that promotes dignity, autonomy and personal recovery,” Dr. Karl Looper, JGH Chief of Psychiatry, shares at the recent inauguration of the Carole and Andrew Harper Psychiatry Inpatient Unit on the third floor of Pavilion B.



Construction of the unit would not have been possible without the support of generous donors. Philanthropists contributed \$5 million, including a major gift from the estate of the late Carole and Andrew Harper, and significant funds were raised from the Foundation’s Mindstrong and Peace of Mind campaigns.

The new unit is a major leap forward, covering 2,600m², with much more space, beds in private rooms, the latest amenities and a modern design that emphasizes privacy and healing—and incorporates elements suggested from the patients themselves. A special geriatric section and occupational therapy room are also part of the new facilities. “The result will be profound and will have lasting benefits for countless individuals for many years to come,” Dr. Looper adds.



IMPROVING OUTCOMES FOR LUNG CANCER PATIENTS

“Thanks to generous donors like Maxime Rémillard, our scientists will be able to advance knowledge and make the breakthrough discoveries that are needed to understand lung cancer in multiple dimensions,” says Bram Freedman, President and CEO of the JGH Foundation.

Named for his mother who lost her 2-year battle with the disease, the Karen Anthony Consortium for Lung Cancer Research will enable massive amounts of data on lung cancer to be integrated into a single, accessible repository. Scientists will then use artificial intelligence to generate sophisticated algorithms to churn the data and customize treatments—improving lung cancer patients’ outcomes and increasing their odds for survival.

“The excellence and integrity of the JGH and its medical staff have instilled great confidence in me to proceed with this philanthropic initiative,” says Mr. Rémillard. “I know that this is exactly what she would have done, if she had had a chance.”

MORE EXAMPLES OF YOUR IMPACT

- Expansion of the Marlene & Joel King Breast Referral and Investigation Centre—among the busiest and highly regarded centres in Quebec—to remain at the forefront of breast cancer diagnosis through additional facilities and state-of-the-art 3D mammography.
- The volunteer-led and Foundation-funded HELP (Hospital Elder Life Program) has increasingly improved outcomes for elderly in-patients. The JGH is the only hospital in Quebec to have implemented this WHO-recognized initiative.
- Through the tremendous generosity of the Doggone Foundation, we have established the only publicly available comprehensive therapy program for trauma in the province of Quebec—as part of the Elspeth McConnell Mental Health and Wellness Centre, a thriving hub for intensive outpatient mental health care.
- A rising incidence of osteoporotic fractures increases the need for life-enhancing, clinically-advanced treatment. With the support of the Fondation Famille Godin, the Department of Orthopedics has recruited top Fellows dedicated to various orthopedic sub-specialties to enhance patient care and contribute to innovative procedures and research.



LAUNCH OF NOVEL COMMAND CENTRE BRINGS THE FUTURE TO THE PRESENT

It's "All systems go!" in the successful launch of our new digital nerve centre at the JGH—the first of its kind in Canada—where real-time data, advanced technology and predictive software are providing a panoramic view of healthcare activities throughout our CIUSSS, all with the aim of improving care.

In fact, this innovative initiative has been named C4 as part of the Hospital's concept of 'Care Everywhere' and because it focuses on 'better Care through Communication, Collaboration and Creation'.

Largely made possible through your donor dollars to the Foundation, the C4 Command Centre plays a vital role by tracking the intricate and interconnected activities of all the healthcare institutions within the CIUSSS West-Central, enabling us to be more effective, proactive, streamlined and responsive. C4 will also allow healthcare professionals to more efficiently assess patients wherever they happen to be, through the use of home monitoring tools, such as smart watches and smart phone applications.



GROUNDBREAKING INNOVATIONS FOR THE JGH'S CARDIAC CATHETERIZATION LABORATORY

The JGH has become the first Quebec hospital to use balloon technology to unblock pulmonary arterial obstructions without open-chest surgery. The procedure—a balloon pulmonary angioplasty—is now possible with the installation of the most advanced version of a bi-plane table. Its pair of movable scanners capture real-time images of the patient's pulmonary arteries from any two angles at the same time, enabling the team in the Kendall Family Cardiac Catheterization Laboratory to work more accurately and efficiently.

"Every time we acquire new equipment, there's a quantum leap in what we can do," Dr. Mark Eisenberg, Director of the Kendall Family Cardiac Catheterization Laboratory, says. As one of only a handful of centres in the world with the capability of performing this procedure, the JGH is taking the lead—thanks in part to donors.



REIMAGINING THE FUTURE OF HEALTHCARE WITH OROT, A PIONEERING JGH DIGITAL HEALTH INITIATIVE

The newly launched OROT Connected Health Innovation Hub is a catalyst for real change in healthcare delivery, with the JGH—thanks to funding by the Foundation—spearheading the way and ushering in a new era of Connected Care in Quebec. OROT brings together the latest digital technology and leaders in the industry in order to incubate and uncover the most innovative, efficient and cost-effective ways of responding to changing healthcare system and patient needs.

MORE EXAMPLES OF YOUR IMPACT

- Fully digitizing and connecting patient health records across the Hospital and the CIUSSS West-Central into one integrated electronic health record provides real-time access and benefit to patients, healthcare providers and caregivers.
- Optimizing personalized medicine including screening programs, molecular diagnosis, targeted treatment of common diseases and appropriate recommendations using genetic and genomic analysis.
- Making use of artificial intelligence and advanced predictive modeling unlocks the potential to deliver exceptional care without exception. This was borne out during the pandemic, when the JGH led the way in COVID-19 data analytics to anticipate trends and plan effectively as patient volume increased and shifted.
- JGH named among Microsoft Canada's Top-10 stories of 2020 for use of hololens/mixed reality technology.



GROUND-BREAKING RESEARCH

Improved diagnoses. Earlier detection. New and improved therapies. These can only be achieved through extensive clinical and laboratory research—a cornerstone of the JGH and its Lady Davis Institute for Medical Research.

As one of Canada's largest and most influential research centres and noted for breakthroughs in the fields of AIDS, aging, cancer and genetics, we are deeply committed to investing in novel approaches to help the JGH remain at the forefront of scientific discovery and clinical excellence—for the benefit of us all.



LARGEST BIOBANK IN CANADA TO PERSONALIZE DIAGNOSES AND TREATMENTS

With vital early support from the Jewish General Hospital Foundation, Dr. Brent Richards—a researcher and endocrinologist at the JGH—and his colleagues have built the country's largest hospital-based COVID research study and contributed data and half of all samples to the province-wide *Biobanque Québec* COVID-19 program.

The goal of the research is to find therapies capable of preventing severe disease. “We have identified some of the clear risk factors for severe COVID and we are using that information to collaborate with drug development partners.” Early in the pandemic, philanthropist Sophie Desmarais contributed \$500,000 to the JGH for COVID research; of that sum, \$150,000 went to Dr. Richards' biobank, well before government funding came through. “It meant we were able to start spending money—and that allowed us to push forward early on in the pandemic to create a research infrastructure.”



TAKING STEM CELL RESEARCH TO THE NEXT LEVEL

For Dr. François Mercier, LDI Researcher, "Foundation funds serve as an incubator helping to kick start my laboratory and build a team in stem cell research. Our aim is to translate our findings into new ways of personalizing blood cancer treatments for patients at the JGH, in Canada and around the world."

Using novel technologies such as CRISPR genome editing in vivo and single-cell RNA sequencing technologies, Dr. Mercier's team is seeking novel approaches to mobilize abnormal cells for more efficient elimination or enhance the regeneration of blood stem cells.

- *Québec Science* names Lady Davis Institute's pediatric brain tumour study, co-led by investigator Dr. Claudia Kleinman of the JGH, among top 10 discoveries in Quebec for 2020.
- New diagnostic standard for pulmonary embolism revealed through clinical trial published in *The New England Journal of Medicine*, led by JGH doctors Dr. Marc Afilalo, Chief of the Emergency Department, and Dr. Andrew Hirsch, Chief of Pulmonary Medicine.
- Dr. Susan Kahn, Director of the JGH Centre of Excellence in Thrombosis and Anticoagulation Care (CETAC) and Senior Investigator with the Centre for Clinical Epidemiology, has been appointed to serve on the Technical Expert Panel of Thrombostasis of the World Health Organization (WHO) Advisory Group on Therapeutics Prioritization for COVID-19.
- Lead Lady Davis investigator and JGH radio-oncologist, Dr. Té Vuong, is internationally recognized for her expertise in the area of colorectal cancer. Donor support has funded groundbreaking multi-site research regarding the elimination of surgery in rectal cancer.

The annual Signature event in support of mental health initiatives at the JGH looked a little different this year. But the show must go on, as they say. CHRISTMAS CAROLS FOR RESEARCH

In addition to his work as Head of the Cancer Genomics and Translational Research Laboratory at the JGH, as a surgical scientist at the Lady Davis Institute and as Associate Professor in the Departments of Surgery and Oncology at McGill, Dr. Mark Basik is also a musical maestro.

Since 2016, as choirmaster, he has led the Communion and Liberation Choir as part of the Christmas Carols for Research annual fundraiser, benefitting his breakthrough research on brain resistant cancers.

Funds raised from the 2019 and 2020 (alternative event) season have enabled Dr. Basik's lab to quadruple their number of mouse tumour models as part of their advanced research on resistant breast cancers. Using tumour samples from JGH patients, their mouse models, called PDX, make it possible to customize each patient's breast cancer treatment.

Today, thanks to this generous support, the JGH is the only hospital in Canada to offer patients new, personalized treatment options based on these models.

HIGHLIGHTS

The generosity of the JGH Foundation community continues to inspire, particularly during these difficult times. We are thrilled to report that we raised \$49.1M in gifts and pledges—the second highest annual total in our history. Not only did your support ensure that the JGH led the way in the pandemic fight—by contributing \$5.6 million to our COVID-19 Fund, but you also continued to support the Hospital through many other meaningful and impactful investments all year long. In fact, in 2021, our total number of gifts for the year increased significantly to an impressive 41,000—the most in a single year in almost a decade.

This year, Annual Giving Programs raised an impressive \$3.5M while our Tribute Funds raised over \$1.3M. Planned Gifts resulted in additional gifts and pledges of over \$5.2M. Given that events were significantly curtailed due to pandemic restrictions, we are pleased that so many continued to support our Signature and Community Partner Events to the tune of \$3.8M. We are incredibly fortunate to have received over \$35.1M in Major and Leadership Gifts, including \$18.9 million from gifts of \$1M or more—one of the highest years at this level on record.
